

Book Jacket Project

Halloween Drama


For this book report project, you will create a book jacket that tells about the drama you read as well as important story elements.

- It is worth 250 points and is due Friday.


Construction

1. You will be given a piece of construction paper.
2. From the left side, measure in 2 inches and place a light pencil mark.
3. Also place a mark 5 1/2 inches from the left side.
4. Repeat steps 2 and 3 three times down the poster board.
5. With a ruler and a pencil, lightly draw a line along the 2-inch marks and the 3 1/2-inch marks.
6. Follow steps 2-5 measuring from the right side of the paper. It should look like the illustration below.

7. Fold the poster board inward along the 2-inch guidelines.
8. Fold the poster board inward along the 3 1/2-inch guidelines so that it looks like a book jacket. It should now look like the illustration to the right.
9. Open up the book jacket and place it in front of you so that the outside of the book jacket is facing up. Starting from the left, lightly number the panels 1-5. Detailed instructions will be given to you as to what to include on each panel.
10. Turn the book jacket over. Starting from the left, lightly number the panels 6-10. Detailed instructions will be given to you as to what to include on each panel.



You are now ready to start creating the panels for your book jacket.

- Follow the directions given carefully to complete each panel.
- All writing must be dark enough to read easily on the construction paper.
- Any pictures required must be colored.
- All labels must be creatively written, and colored.
- All sentences must be complete, correctly capitalized and punctuated in order to earn points.
- All paragraphs must be indented, contain at least five sentences, and be on topic.

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Panel 1 – Reviewer’s information (25 pts)

This panel will contain information about the person reviewing the play – you!:

1. Label
 - a. Says “Reviewer Information” (1 pt)
 - b. Creatively written (1 pt)
 - c. Colored (1 pt)
2. Self Portrait
 - a. A picture of yourself (4 pts)
 - b. Colored (1 pt)
3. Autobiographical Information
 - a. Your name (3 pts)
 - b. Your age (2 pts)
 - c. A grammatically correct sentence stating where you go to school (6 pts)
 - d. A grammatically correct sentence stating why you are qualified to review this play (6 pts)

Panel 2 – Highlights and Review (42 pts)

This panel will contain two sections.

1. Highlights
 - a. Label
 1. Says “Highlights” (1 pt)
 2. Creatively written (1 pt)
 3. Colored (1 pt)
 - b. Using three grammatically correct sentences, tell three exciting or interesting things that happen in the play. (6 pts each = 18 pts)
2. Review
 - a. Label
 1. Says “Review” (1 pt)
 2. Creatively written (1 pt)
 3. Colored (1 pt)
 - b. Grammatically correct sentence #1: tell what you like about the drama (6 pts)
 - c. Grammatically correct sentence #2: tell what you dislike about the drama (6 pts)
 - d. Grammatically correct sentence #3: tell whether or not you would recommend someone else read this drama, and explain why (6 pts)

Panel 3 – Spine (16 pts)

This is what you would see if this book jacket were on a book that was on a shelf with other books. It should catch the reader’s eye, and make the reader want to pull it off the shelf and read it. Do your writing horizontally.

1. Title
 - a. Label
 1. Says “Title” and is followed by a colon (:) (1 pt)
 2. Creatively written (1 pt)
 3. Colored (1 pt)
 - b. The title of the play is written out (5 pts)
2. Genre
 - a. Label
 1. Says “Genre” and is followed by a colon (:) (1 pt)
 2. Creatively written (1 pt)
 3. Colored (1 pt)
 - b. The genre of the play is written out

Panel 4 – Front cover (31 pts)

It’s particularly important that this panel be eye-catching and appealing, as it is the front of the book. It will contain much of the same information as the spine, but bigger, in more detail, and more eye-catching.

1. Title
 - a. The title of the play is written out (5 pts)
 - b. It is written creatively (1 pt)
 - c. It is colored (1)
2. Genre
 - a. The genre of the play is written out (5 pts)
 - b. It is written creatively (1 pt)
 - c. It is colored (1)
3. Your Name
 - a. Your name is written out (5 pts)
 - b. It is written creatively (1 pt)
 - c. It is colored (1 pt)
4. Picture
 - a. A picture is drawn on the cover (5 pts)
 - b. The picture is relevant to the drama (4 pts)
 - c. The picture is colored (1 pt)

Panel 5 - Theme (9 pts)

Tell what the theme of the drama is ... what message is the author trying to get across?

1. Label
 - a. Says "Theme" (1 pt)
 - b. Creatively written (1 pt)
 - c. Colored (1 pt)
2. A grammatically correct sentence stating the theme of the drama (6 pts)

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Panel 6 - conflict and resolution (28 pts)

On this panel, identify the main conflict, and the resolution, of the drama

1. Main Conflict
 - a. Label
 1. Says "Main Conflict" (1 pt)
 2. Creatively written (1 pt)
 3. Colored (1 pt)
 - b. A grammatically correct sentence identifying the main conflict (6 pts)
 - c. Picture
 1. Present (1 pt)
 2. Shows conflict (3 pts)
 3. Colored (1 pt)
2. Resolution
 - a. Label
 1. Says "Resolution" (1 pt)
 2. Creatively written (1 pt)
 3. Colored (1 pt)
 - b. A grammatically correct sentence identifying the resolution of the main conflict (6 pts)
 - c. Picture
 1. Present (1 pt)
 2. Shows resolution (3 pts)
 3. Colored (1 pt)



Panel 7 – Main Character (22 pts)

This panel will be all about one of the main characters of the drama.

1. Label
 - a. Says “Main Character” (1 pt)
 - b. Creatively written (1 pt)
 - c. Colored (1 pt)
2. Name
 - a. Main character’s name is present (1 pt)
 - b. Creatively written (1 pt)
 - c. Colored (1 pt)
3. Picture
 - a. Of main character (4 pts)
 - b. Colored (1 pt)
4. A grammatically correct sentence explaining the character’s importance to the plot (6 pts)
5. 5 adjectives that describe the main character (5 pts)



Panel 8 – Setting (15 pts)

This panel is about the setting of the drama.

1. Label
 - a. Says “Setting” (1 pt)
 - b. Creatively written (1 pt)
 - c. Colored (1 pt)
2. Horizontally written:
 - a. A grammatically correct sentence stating where the drama takes place (6 pts)
 - b. A grammatically correct sentence stating when the drama takes place (6 pts)



Panel 9 – Summary (34 pts)

This panel will provide the reader with a good idea of what the drama is all about.

1. Label
 - a. Says “Summary” (1 pt)
 - b. Creatively written (1 pt)
 - c. Colored (1 pt)
2. A grammatically correct paragraph that briefly tells the important parts of the beginning, middle, and ending of the drama’s storyline. (31 pts)



Panel 10 – Vocabulary (18 pts)

Choose five words from the drama that may be unfamiliar to readers. Create a vocabulary list.

1. Label
 - a. Says “Vocabulary” (1 pt)
 - b. Creatively written (1 pt)
 - c. Colored (1 pt)
2. List
 - a. Contains five words (1 pt/word = 5 pts)
 - b. Each word is defined (2 pts/definition = 10 pts)



Miscellaneous Requirements (10 pts)

In addition to the above, will earn points for the following:

1. Your overall project is neat. (3 pts)
2. Your overall project is creative. (3 pts)
3. Your overall project is appealing (4 pts)
